

# **IDF Code of Ethics**

# approved by the IDF Board of Directors

#### **Preamble**

It is the aim of the IDF, its member associations, officers and the Darts family to promote the highest possible ethical values within Dart sports.

The IDF is committed to the Olympic Charter and its fundamental principles.

In furtherance of this aim the IDF Board of Directors has adopted this Code of Ethics based on the principles and rules of the IOC Code of Ethics.

At all times IDF, and in the framework of events organized and/or sanctioned by IDF, the participants undertake to respect and ensure respect of the present Code.

This Code of Ethics applies to IDF Officers (holding any position in the IDF Executive Committee, Boardof Directors or Commissions), IDF staff (including consultants, agents and any person acting on behalf of IDF) and to all participants in IDF sanctioned events in a capacity whatsoever, in particular athletes and the athlete's entourage.

## A. EQUALITY and DIGNITY

- 1. Safeguarding the dignity of the individual is a fundamental requirement of Olympism.
- There shall be no discrimination between the participants on the basis of race, gender, ethnic origin, religion, philosophical or political opinion, marital status, sexual orientation or other grounds.
- 3. All doping practices at all levels are strictly prohibited. The provisions against doping in the World Anti-Doping Code shall be scrupulously observed.
- 4. All forms of harassment of participants, be it physical, professional or sexual, and any physical or mental injuries to participants, are prohibited.
- 5. All forms of participation in, or support for betting related to IDF sanctioned events, and all formsof promotion of betting related to IDF sanctioned events are prohibited.
- 6. Also, in the context of betting, participants in IDF sanctioned events must not, by any manner whatsoever, infringe the principle of fair play, show non-sporting conduct, or attempt to influence the course or result of a competition, or any part thereof, in a manner contrary to sporting ethics.
- 7. IDF and the Olympic parties shall guarantee the athletes' conditions of safety, well-being and medical care favorable to their physical and mental equilibrium.

## **B. INTEGRITY**

- IDF officers and staff or their representatives shall not, directly or indirectly, solicit, accept or
  offer any form of remuneration or commission, nor any concealed benefit or service of any nature,
  connected with the organization of IDF sanctioned events. An exception may be granted if such
  remuneration, commission, benefit or service is pre-approved by the IDF Board upon recommendation
  of the Ethics Commission according to the IDF Conflict of Interest Policy.
- 2. Only gifts of nominal value, in accordance with prevailing local customs, may be given or accepted by IDF officers and staff or their representatives, as a mark of respect or friendship. Any other gift must be passed on to the organization of which the beneficiary is a member.
- 3. The hospitality shown to IDF officers and staff and the persons accompanying them shall not exceed the standards prevailing in the host country.
- 4. IDF officers and staff shall respect the Rules Concerning Conflicts of Interests.
- 5. IDF officers and staff shall use due care and diligence in fulfilling their mission. They must not actin a manner likely to tarnish the reputation of IDF, the Darts family and the Olympic Movement.
- 6. IDF officers and staff, their agents or their representatives must not be involved with firms or persons whose activity or reputation is inconsistent with the principles set out in the Olympic Charter and the present Code.

## C. GOOD GOVERNANCE AND RESOURCES

- 1. The basic universal principles of good governance of the Olympic and sports movement, in particular transparency, responsibility and accountability, must be respected.
- 2. The income and expenditure of IDF shall be recorded in its accounts, which must be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. An independent auditor will check these accounts.
- 3. IDF recognizes the significant contribution that broadcasters, sponsors, partners and other supporters of sports events make to the development and prestige of IDF sanctioned events throughout the world. However, such support must be in a form consistent with the rules of sport and the principles defined in the Olympic Charter and the present Code. They must not interfere in the running of sports institutions. The organization and staging of sports competitions are the exclusive responsibility of the independent sports organizations recognized by the IOC.

## D. RELATIONS WITH STATES

- 1. IDF shall work to maintain harmonious relations with state authorities, in accordance with the principle of universality and political neutrality of the Olympic Movement.
- 2. IDF is free to play a role in the public life of the states to which they belong. They may not, however, engage in any activity or follow any ideology inconsistent with the principles and rules defined in the Olympic Charter and set out in the present Code.
- 3. IDF shall endeavor to protect the environment on the occasion of any events they organize and undertake to uphold generally accepted standards for environmental protection.

#### **E. CONFIDENTIALITY**

- 1. IDF member associations, officers and staff shall not disclose information entrusted to them in confidence.
- 2. Disclosure of other information shall not be for personal gain or benefit, nor be undertaken maliciously to damage the reputation of any person or organization.

# F. IMPLEMENTATION / ETHICS COMMISSION

- 1. IDF shall see to it that the principles and rules of the Olympic Charter and the present Code are applied.
- 2. The member associations, officers and staff shall inform the IDF President of any of breach of the present Code, with a view to an investigation and possible disciplinary action by the Federation.
- 3. The IDF Ethics Commission will be chaired by the IDF President or a designated representative approved by the Board of Directors and composed of the chair and up to four additional independent members.
- 4. Nominations to the Ethics Commission can be made by each IDF member association and or Olympic Movement party.
- 5. The Ethics Commission will be comprised of such members as determined by the IDF Board of Directors and will be selected under procedures determined by such Board.
- 6. Any disciplinary procedures recommended by the Ethics Commission to the Board shall follow the procedures as outlined in the IDF Conduct Policy.
